Terms & Conditions:

Intellectual Property: all materials purchased and licensed from Amber Film & Photography Collective including, but not limited to, video, audio, graphics, text, images, and interactive media (The Content) belong to Amber or have been licensed to it and are protected by international copyright and trademark laws.

The licensee, through this payment, does not acquire ownership of The Content and may not copy, display, create derivative works from, transmit, perform, modify, display, or sell any information, products or services obtained from it, except as expressly permitted under applicable law or as expressly stated or described in these terms for a specific product.

The Content is licensed solely for classroom teaching, research, educational non-commercial use including multimedia projects, classroom presentations, and individual presentations for use in educational institutions or public libraries.

Grant of License:

Amber Film & Photography Collective grants the licensee a limited, non-exclusive, non-sub licensable, revocable licence to use The Content in an educational setting as described in the above Terms & Conditions.

Public Screening Rights:

These Terms include the right for the licensee to undertake public screenings of The Content. A public screening is a non-theatrical performance of a programme, without charge, outside the home, to a gathering of people other than family members and or acquaintances.
